Why did you decide on a custom build over a display?

The custom build allowed us to maximise the potential of the block and its slope and we didn't have to make the compromises associated with trying to fit a project home onto a unique block.

Do you have any advice for others looking to build a custom home?

A custom home will give you everything you need and nothing you don't. When it's designed in that way and to suit your block it really doesn't cost any more than a project home either.

Can you describe the style of your home?

It's based on a mid-century modern style with connected outdoor/indoor living

areas, a simple open floor plan, flat roof, a breeze block screen wall and lots of glass.

What is your favourite inclusion in your home?

We wanted the house to feel relaxed and open and the central atrium allows for that, giving us garden views from every room and making the focal point of the home an open and healthy area.

Is there anything about the building process you wish you had known earlier?

You can't rush it no matter how much you want to. Once we slowed down and found a builder who suited us the process became very easy, but it doesn't matter how organised you think you are, you need to have patience.

How did you decide on your builder and have you been happy with the results?
